Academic body	Governance, Leadership & Participation	Management & Functioning
University	Vice-Chancellor	Provide leadership to Directors, Deans, Heads, Office bearers, Coordinators and Conveners of various academic bodies/ Committees.
School of Applied Sciences	Dean	Provide leadership and facilitates academic functioning of department, and students within the school.
Department of Criminology and Forensic Science	Head/ Chairman; Board of Studies	Function through Board of Studies (BoS), Departmental Research Committee (DRC), Departmental Staff Council, Other committees and faculty and other employees.

	Non- teaching employees	Assistance in teaching, learning and evaluation process in the department and Maintenance of infrastructure.

At the student level, the management can be described as follows:

Designation	Management & Functioning
Research Scholar	Provide guidance to the students as guided by the faculty in terms of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teaching, • Organizing activities, • Serving as a link between the faculty and the student.
School Representative	Maintaining synergy between the students from different departments at school level.
Class Representative	Representation at classroom level for communicating students’ demands to the higher level.
