APC:24:(01): Confirmation of Minutes of 23rd Regular and of 15th to 23rd Emergent Meetings of the

Academic Program Committee held on 13.09.2017, 28.10.2017, 01 & 02.12.2017,

12.02.2018, 29.05.2018, 16.07.2018, 14.08.2018 and 18.02.2019 respectively.

Resolution: The APC confirmed its minutes of 23rd regular and 15th to 23rd Emergent Meetings

held on 13.09.2017, 28.10.2017, 01 & 02.12.2017, 12.02.2018, 29.05.2018, 16.07.2018,

14.08.2018 and 18.02.2019.

APC:24:(02): Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central

Educational Institutions.

In order to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to a maximum of ten percent of the total seats in each category, Under Secretary to the Government of India, New Delhi, vide his letter F. No. 19-4/2019-(CU). Cdn dated January 23, 2019 requested to furnish the details, as per annexure - (I to IV) latest by 31 January 2019 positively. In order to prepare the data in requisite format and furnish the same to the MHRD/UGC within the stipulated period, a Committee under the Chairmanship of DoAA with members DORD, Prof. G.L. Puntabekar, Prof. P.P. Singh and Deputy Registrar (Academics) as Secretary was constituted. The Committee after extensive exercise prepared the requisite information and same was forwarded to the MHRD on 31 January 2019 itself. In order to provide 10% reservation to EWS without reducing the number and percentage of reservation provided for SC/ST/OBC candidates, as per para 2(d) of the OM of Department of Higher Education F. No. 12-4/2019-U1 dated 17.01.2019, the UGC has advised to fixe target to increase intake capacity by 25% by 2020-21. Accordingly, the Committee has recommended increase of intake capacity-15% in Academic Session 2019-20 and 10% in Academic Session 2020-21 in the Vishwavidyalaya.

The matter is placed before the committee for ratification.

Resolution: The APC after due deliberations resolved to ratify the action taken by the

Vishwavidyalaya under captioned agenda.

APC:24:(3): Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) made between the Vishwavidyalaya and

Chairman/Managing Trustee of Shri 5 Navtanpuri Dham-Khijada Mandir Trust.

An MOU was signed on 23.01.2019 between the Vishwavidyalaya and Chairman/Managing

Trustee of Shri 5 Navtanpuri Dham-Khijada Mandir Trust. As per the MOU, the Second Party will grant Rs. 11, 11,111/- (Eleven Lakh Eleven Thousand and One Hundred Eleven) to establish Krishna Pranami Swadhyapeeth in the Vishwavidyalaya. It will be setup in the Department of Philosophy and from the interest accrued from the FD of the aforesaid amount the financial aid will be granted to the students pursuing research in M.Phil., Ph.D. and Post Doctoral Research in respect of Krishna Pranami sect in the various Department of the Vishwavidyalaya. Before signing the MOU, a Seminar was conducted in the Vishwavidyalaya, under the auspices of the aforesaid Krishna Pranami sect on 24-25 September 2018.

The matter is placed before the committee for ratification.

Resolution: The APC after due deliberations resolved to ratify the action taken by the Vishwavidyalaya under captioned agenda.

APC:24:(04): To consider Prospectus and Admission Brochure for the session 2019-20.

The Admission Committee of the session 2019-20 have prepared Prospectus and Admission Brochure for the session 2019-20 and the same is placed before the APC for consideration. A brief shall be given by Prof. A N Sharma, Coordinator, Admission Cell.

The matter is placed before the committee for consideration.

Resolution: The APC after due deliberations resolved to approve the Prospectus and Admission Brochure for the Academic Session 2019-20, with minor modification like Schedule of Entrance Test, change of Centers viz Indore and Patna taking into account the Election Schedule declared by the Election Commission of India. The APC further resolved to Conduct the Entrance Test on 16th, 17th and 18th May 2019 instead of 15th, 16th, and 17th May 2019, and authorized the Coordinator of Admission Cell to explore the possibility of holding Entrance Test in the Centers nearby Patna and Indore where election is not scheduled on the aforesaid dates.

Further, it was resolved that in respect of admission in Affiliated Colleges, taking into account the previous experience of notification for entrance examination in which only ~5% applications of the total intake were received, *Status Quo* shall be maintained and admission shall be made in each course on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examinations. However, in case of admission in B.Ed programs in affiliated colleges, the Order of the Hon'ble High Court of M.P. should be complied with in letter and spirit.

APC: 24:(05) Allocation of Research Scholars to the Assistant Professors appointed against Rolling Advertisement Dated 30.10.2010.

Majority of Assistant Professors appointed against Rolling Advertisement Dated 30.10.2010 have been raising demands for quite some time for allocation of Research Scholars to them. They have not been allocated Research Scholars for last four years. Citing certain irregularities in respect of their appointment, advisory was sought from MHRD & UGC from time to time on the allocation of Research Scholars to these teachers. But no advisory has so far been received either from UGC or MHRD on the said issue. In between, the then Assistant Register, Academic Affairs, issued a letter dated 06.01.2017 to all Heads of Departments, stating that only those faculty members (Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors) are to be considered for allocation as

supervisor who are confirmed in the service of University. However, as per clause 6.1 of the UGC (Minimum standard and Procedure for Award of M. Phil/Ph.D. Degree) Regulation 2016 - any regular Professor of the University with at least five research publication in refereed journals and any regular Associate Professor/Assistant Professor of the University with a Ph.D. degree and at least two research publication in referred journals may be recognized as Research Supervisor. In pursuance of the resolution passed by the Academic Council in its meeting dated 10 November, 2017, legal opinion on the aforesaid issue was sought from the University Panel Advocate Smt. Shobha Menon, Senior Advocate, High Court of M.P. and Shri Amitesh Kumar, Advocate, Supreme Court of India. Both the opinions were in favour of allocation of Research Scholars to these teachers. The legal opinion states that merely because a person though appointed on regular basis but undergoing the period of Probation cannot be disqualified to be Research Supervisor or Co-Supervisor in terms of the provisions contained in clause 6.1 and 6.2 of the UGC Regulations 2016. Both the legal opinions were placed before the APC in its 19th Emergent meeting dated 12.01.2018 vide item No. 19 (06). The committee considered the legal opinion rendered by the panel Advocates. However, before arriving at the decision of allocation of Ph.D. Research Scholars, the committee resolved to seek further legal opinion on following two points:

- (a) What would be the effect of the decision on the ongoing Court cases to allocate Research Scholars to the teachers who have moved the Hon'ble High court at Jabalpur on the issue of confirmation?
- (b) Whether the teachers terminated on eligibility ground can be considered for supervisor. If yes, what would be its effect on the ongoing Court cases?

Subsequent Legal opinion received in the month of March 2018 on the aforesaid issues was not in favour of allocation of Research Scholars to those Assistant Professor who have gone to Hon'ble High court for confirmation / against termination by the University. Now the situation has changed. The Hon'ble High Court of M.P. at Jabalpur dismissed the Writ Petitions filed on the issue of confirmation vide order dated 12.03.2018 and directed the university to conclude the inquiry in the process of appointments preferably within a period of two months. Thereafter, the matter was referred to the Visitor (President of India). The President of India in his capacity as the Visitor of the University in exercise of powers conferred upon him under Section 8(3) of the Central Universities Act 2009, ordered for Visitorial Inquiry. The aforesaid Visitorial Inquiry committee after having examining all the relevant records submitted its report to the MHRD. The response of the MHRD thereon is yet to be received. In this context, it is submitted that as per Section 5 of the Central Universities Act 2009, the object of the University shall be to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing Instructional and Research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit. It is a matter of fact that these teachers are only contributing in providing instructional facility and they have not been afforded opportunity to make their contribution in providing research despite the fact that they are eligible to be Research Supervisor in terms of UGC Regulations 2016. It is needless to say that Research is an important component for NIRF Ranking and NAAC Accreditation.

In view of above and in the larger interest of the University and students community, it would be expedient that a policy decision should be taken, at the earliest, to allocate Research Scholars to the Assistant Professors appointed against the Rolling Advertisement dated 30.10.2010 in the ensuing Academic Session 2019-20.

The matter is placed before the committee for consideration.

Resolution:

After due deliberations, the APC unanimously resolved to approve that the Assistant Professors appointed in 2013 vide Rolling Advertisement dated 30.10.2010 be made Supervisors and Senior Faculty of the Department be made Co-supervisor against the vacant seats in PhD program under the senior faculty. While doing so, provisions of UGC on maximum seats, at any point of time, for PhD supervision for each cadre of teachers be taken into account.

APC:24:(06):

Issue of allocation of Supervisor to Shri Ramesh Singh, Research Scholar, in the Department of Chemistry.

Shri Ramesh Singh qualified joint CSIR-UGC Test for Junior Research Fellowship and Eligibility for Lectureship (NET) held on 20/12/2015. The result of the said test was declared on 16/05/2016. The fellowship was tenable w.e.f. 01/07/2016. He was allowed to join the Department of Chemistry of this Vishwavidyalaya for pursuing Ph.D. in the subject of Chemistry under the scheme of the JRF in Science w.e.f. 31/08/2016. In the said joining report, Dr. K.B. Joshi, Assistant Professor, has been shown as Guide/Supervisor of Shri Ramesh Singh. The said joining report is duly forwarded by the then HoD Chemistry and the then Registrar. On the basis of aforesaid joining report, fellowship was released by the UGC in favor of Research Scholar Shri Ramesh Singh. Thereafter, continuation certificates containing the name of Dr. K.B. Joshi as Supervisor were forwarded to the UGC from time to time. The said certificates were duly forwarded by the Head of the Department and the Registrar. Even in the half yearly progress report forwarded to the UGC from time to time by the HoD and Registrar of the University Dr. K.B. Joshi has been shown as Supervisor of the Research Scholar Shri Ramesh Singh.

In the Meeting of Board of Studies (Local) held on 24/10/2017 under the Chairmanship of Head of the Department, Dr. Farid Khan, the HoD Chemistry was made Supervisor of the Research Scholar Shri Ramesh Singh on the basis of research interest of the candidate. The candidate has never been inclined to carry on his research in the specialization earned by Dr. Farid Khan. The record clearly depicts that the research scholar has evinced interest to carry on his research in the specialization earned by Dr. K.B. Joshi only. Further, even after the aforesaid BoS Meeting, the registration form of the Research Scholar was forwarded by the HoD on 29.12.2017 showing Dr. K.B. Joshi as Supervisor. The interest of the research scholar needs to be protected in all situations. Records show that the candidate is eligible for Senior Research Fellowship w.e.f. 01/09/2018, but due to aforesaid reasons; the research work of the candidate has not been evaluated so far. Due to this, research scholar is in monetary loss. His research work is also held up.

Further, in the Meeting of the Board of Studies (Local) held on 30/11/2018 under the chairmanship of HoD, it was resolved to refer the matter to the DoAA to seek the Guidance on eligibility of Dr. K.B. Joshi as co-supervisor of Shri Ramesh Singh. Again on representation dated 05/12/2018 of Shri Ramesh Singh, the HoD endorsed the DoAA to decide the eligibility of Dr. K.B. Joshi as Supervisor. Whereas there is nothing on record to rendering Dr. K.B. Joshi ineligible to be Supervisor of the research scholar Shri Ramesh Singh. Accordingly, HoD was requested to use his good offices to impress upon the Members of the Board of Studies of the Department to re-consider their earlier decision dated 24/10/2017 and allow Shri Ramesh Singh to continue his research work under the Supervision of Dr. K.B. Joshi. In pursuance thereof, the matter was discussed in the meeting of Board of Studies (BoS) of the Department of Chemistry held on 08.02.2019 and BoS resolved that there is no clear instruction/opinion regarding the matter,

hence, the matter may be referred to Academic Council. The regular meeting of the Academic Council is not yet scheduled. The aggrieved research scholar is pressing hard as his research work is adversely suffering and he is also in monetary loss due to pendency of award of SRF.

The matter is placed before the committee for consideration.

Resolution:

In view of the circumstances stated in the captioned agenda and after due deliberations, the APC unanimously resolved to approve that Dr. K.B. Joshi be allowed to continue as Supervisor and Prof. Farid Khan as Co-supervisor of the Research Scholar Shri Ramesh Singh.

Issue of allocation of Supervisor to Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal, Research Scholar, in the Department of Chemistry

Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal joined as Junior Research Fellow in the project tilted "Exceptional Rare-Earth Nanomaterials Morphed via Ionic Liquids", on 21/12/2015. The principle Investigator of this project is Dr. Pushpal Ghosh. Certificates regarding progress of the work of Research Fellow Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal were issued from time to time during the period 2015-17, containing the name of the Supervisor Dr. Pushpal Ghosh. The said certificates were duly forwarded by the HoD Chemistry, whereas, Dr. Pushpal Ghosh ought to have been shown as P.I. (Principal Investigator) of the project in place of Supervisor. Subsequently Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal qualified the Ph.D. Entrance Test of this Vishwavidyalaya in year 2017. The result was declared on 12/09/2017

In the Meeting of Board of Studies (Local) held on 24/10/2017 under the Chairmanship of Head of the Department, Prof. Archana Pandey was made Supervisor of the Research Scholar Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal on the basis of research interest of the candidate. The candidate has never been inclined to carry on his research in the specialization earned by Prof. Archana Pandey. The record clearly depicts that the research scholar has evinced interest to carry on his research in the specialization earned by Dr. Pushpal Ghosh only. Some papers of the research scholar Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal along with Dr. Pushpal Ghosh have also been published in National/International Journals. The interest of the research scholar needs to be protected in all situations. Records show that even after the aforesaid meeting of BoS, registration form of the research scholar Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal containing the name of Dr. Pushpal Ghosh as Supervisor has been forwarded by the HoD Chemistry on 29/12/2017 and further the application form for SRF-1 of Council of Scientific and Industrial Research showing the name of Dr. Pushpal Ghosh as proposed Guide/Supervisor has been forwarded by the Head of Department on 05/07/2018. Subsequently, in the Meeting of the Board of Studies (Local) held on 30/11/2018 under the chairmanship of HoD, it was resolved to refer the matter to the DoAA to seek the Guidance on eligibility of Dr. Pushpal Ghosh as co-supervisor of Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal. Whereas there is nothing on record to rendering Dr. Pushpal Ghosh ineligible to be Supervisor of the research scholar of Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal. Accordingly, in the best interest of the research scholar, HoD was requested to use his good offices to impress upon the Members of the Board of Studies of the Department to re-consider their earlier decision dated 24/10/2017 and allow Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal to continue his research work under the Supervision of Dr. Pushpal Ghosh. In pursuance thereof, the matter was discussed in the meeting of Board of Studies (BoS) held on 08.02.2019 and BoS resolved that there is no clear instruction/opinion regarding the

matter hence the matter may be referred to Academic Council. The regular meeting of the Academic Council is not yet scheduled. The aggrieved research scholar is pressing hard as his research work is suffering.

The matter is placed before the committee for consideration.

Resolution:

In view of the circumstances stated in the captioned agenda and after due deliberations, the APC unanimously resolved to approve that Dr. Pushpal Ghosh be allowed to continue as Supervisor and Prof. Archana Pandey as Co-supervisor of the Research Scholar Shri Yogendra Nath Chouryal.

The Ph.D. Program of these Research Scholars is governed by Ordinance 23(A). As per clause 4.1 of the Ordinance 23(A) (effective from academic session 2016-17), Ph.D. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of three years, including course work and a maximum of six years.

The Research Scholar Ms. Paisnee Patel has submitted that she has completed the required minimum attendance of 4 consecutive semesters from the registration date (12th August 2016 to 13th May 2018). She has also completed her field work of both seasons (preand post monsoon). The analysis of Groundwater samples of one season is complete and of the other season is under process. She has been appointed as Jr. Hydro geologist (Grade-1) in May 2018. She has requested to allow her to complete Ph.D. work.

The Research Scholar Mr. Ved Prakash Maurya has submitted that he is a visually challenged candidate. He is a trained Clinical Psychologist from institute of Human Behavior and Allied Sciences (IHBAS) where he completed his M Phil Clinical Psychology Degree in 2013. He has been offered to join the post of Assistant Professor in a Hospital Management Institute from August 2018. His research work is in advance stage. Singh, Prof. R.K. Trivedi, and Prof. M.S. Tiwari and COE as members was constituted to prepare the guidelines for re-valuation. The APC also resolved that re-valuation should be allowed only in case of last semester of the course. It also resolved that re-totaling in any semester should be dispensed with. The Committee prepared the Guidelines in the form of Ordinance 22(A). The Guidelines provide re-valuation of Core Courses only in Theory Papers. The Guidelines also provide for re-totaling of answer script of all the Theory Courses.
