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ECO-CC-111 (PRINCIPLES OF MICRO ECONOMICS)

This course intends to expose the student to the basic principles in Microeconomic Theory and illustrate with applications.

ECO-CC-311 (PRINCIPLES OF MACRO ECONOMICS)

This course introduces students to the basic concepts in Macroeconomics. Macroeconomics deals with the aggregate economy. In this course the students are introduced to the definition, measurement of the macroeconomic variables like GDP, consumption, savings, investment and balance of payments.

ECO-SE-311 (DATA ANALYSIS)

This course is to be offered by the students in economics. In order to understand economic problems clearly, the knowledge of quantitative techniques in the area of mathematics and statistics.

ECO- EC -511 (QUANTITATIVE METHODS)

This course is to be offered by the students in economics. In order to understand economic problems clearly, the knowledge of quantitative techniques in the area of mathematics and statistics.

ECO- EC -512 (MONEY AND BANKING)

This course exposes student to the theory and functioning of the monetary and financial sector of the economy. it highlights the organization, structure and role of financial markets and institutions. it also discusses interest rates, monetary management and instruments of monetary control. Financial and banking sector reforms and monetary policy with special reference to India are also covered.

ECO- EC -513 (ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT)

This course reviews major trends in aggregate economic indicators in India and places these against the backdrop of major policy debates in India in the post – Independence period.

ECO- SE -511 (FINANCIAL ECONOMICS)

This course exposes student to the theory and functioning of the monetary and financial sector of the economy. it highlights the organization, structure and role of financial markets and institutions. Financial and banking sector reforms and monetary policy with special reference to India are also covered.

ECO- GE -511 (INDIAN ECONOMY)

The paper is on overall social, political and economic environment influencing policy decisions. To develop all these themes, the course is divided into specific modules.

ECO-EC-612 (PUBLIC FINANCE)

This course is non-technical overview of government finances with special reference to India. It will look into the efficiency and equity aspects of taxation of the centre, states and the local governments and the issues of fiscal federalism and decentralization in India. The course

will be useful for students aiming towards careers in the government sector, policy analysis, business and journalism.

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ECO-CC-121 (MICRO ECONOMIC ANALYSIS)

This course is designed to expose the students to the basic principles of microeconomic theory. The emphasis will be on thinking like an economist and the course will illustrate how microeconomic.

ECO-CC-122 (QUANTITATIVE METHODS)

The main objective of this paper is to train the students to use the techniques of mathematical and statistical analysis, which are commonly applied to understand and analyze economic problems.

ECO-CC-123 (PUBLIC FINANCE)

This paper combines a thorough understanding of fiscal institutions with a careful analysis of the issues which underline budgetary policies in general and Indian experience in particular.

ECO-CC-124 (INDIAN ECONOMY)

The paper is on overall social, political and Economic environment influencing policy decisions. To develop all these themes, the course is divided into specific modules.

ECO-CC-321 (MACRO ECONOMIC ANALYSIS)

The paper entitled “Macro Economic Analysis” equips the students at the postgraduate level to understand systemic facts and latest theoretical developments for empirical analysis.

ECO-CC-322 (INTERNATIONAL TRADE AND FINANCE)

The course provides a deep understanding about the broad principles and theories, which tend to govern the free flow of trade in goods, services and capital, both short-term and long-term.

ECO-CC-323 (DEVELOPMENT ECONOMICS)

The important issues in the context of development such as infrastructure-linkages, role of development, importance of domestic macroeconomic policies.

ECO-EC-321 (LABOUR ECONOMICS)

This paper exposes students to theoretical as well as empirical issues relating to the labour market with special reference to India.

ECO-EC-322 (AGRICULTURE ECONOMICS)

The objective of this course is to provide a detailed treatment of issues in agricultural economics to those intending to specialize in this area. Its objective is to familiarize students with policy issues.

. ECO-EC-323 (ADVANCE BANKING)

The course provides a deep understanding about the broad principles and theories. This course exposes student to the theory and functioning of the monetary and financial sector of the

economy. it highlights the organization, structure and role of financial markets and institutions. Financial and banking sector reforms and monetary policy with special reference to India are also covered.

ECO-EC-421 (INDUSTRIAL ECONOMICS)

The objective of this course is to provide a detailed treatment of issues in industrial economics to those intending to specialize in this area. Its objective is to familiarize students with policy issues regarding industrial development

ECO-EC-422 (RURAL ECONOMY)

The objective of this course is to provide a detailed treatment of issues pertaining to rural development to those intending to specialize in this area. Its objective is to familiarize students with the theory of rural development issues that are relevant to Indian countryside and enable them to understand and analyze the problems of rural development.

ECO-EC-423 (HISTORY OF ECONOMIC THOUGHT)

A critical study of the economic theories of the past and economic ideas of the great economic thinkers of the past is at once challenging and illuminating and enlightening.

ECO-OE-321 (INDIAN ECONOMY)
