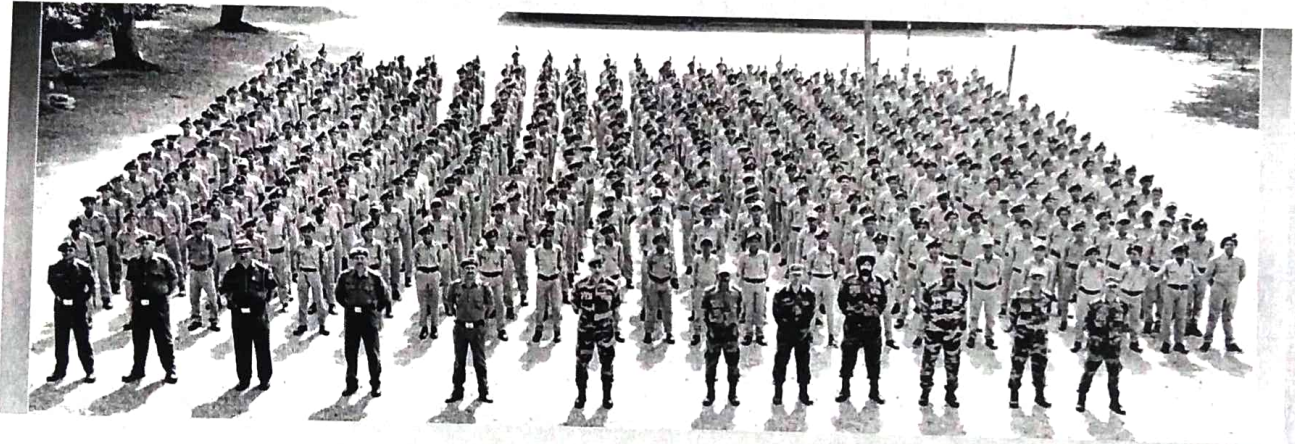
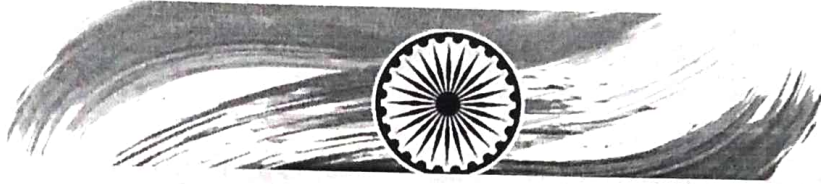

About the National Cadet Corps – The birth of National Cadet Corps (NCC) in India was conceptualized and raised before independence and can be traced as ‘**University Corps**’ created under Indian Defense Act – 1917 to reserve the shortage in Army. The ‘University Corps’ became ‘**University Training Corps**’ after the enactment of Indian Territorial Act – 1920 to make it more attractive among the youth of India. After the recommendation of Cadet Corps Committee constituted on 29 September 1946 under the chairmanship of Pandit Hriday Narayan Kunzru, the ‘University Training Corps’ became ‘**National Cadet Corps**’. A Draft Bill for constituting such a corps was submitted for deliberations to Constituent Assembly (Legislative) on 19 March 1948 and the Bill received the final assent of the Governor General on 16 April 1948, and the National Cadet Corps came into being by an Act of the Parliament Act No. XXXI of 1948 designated ‘The National Cadet Corps Act 1948’. This Act with 13 clauses, prescribed the formation of the National Cadet Corps in India. Thus, the NCC which has now more than 15 lakh cadets on its strength, had started with only 20,000 cadets just after independence i.e. in the 1948. After independence formerly, a total of 96 NCC units of Senior Division were raised, comprising variety of units to include one Armored Corps, three Artillery Corps, five Engineer Corps, two Signal Corps, two Medical Corps and 83 companies of Infantry. The girl’s division of the NCC was raised in July 1949. On 01 April 1950, Air Wing was raised, with one Air Squadron each at Bombay and Kolkata. The Naval Wing of the NCC was raised in July 1952, thus completing the true representation of all services in the Corps. Now NCC is a Tri-Services organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force. NCC in India is a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges and universities across India. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selections based on the achievements in the corps.

Organizational Structure & Functioning of NCC – The NCC units across the India are functioning under the Ministry of Defence. The headquarter of NCC is situated in New Delhi. The NCC in India is headed by a Director General, an Army Officer of the rank of Lieutenant General. Director General, the supreme head is basically responsible for the functioning of the National Cadet Corps in the country through the National Cadet Corps Headquarters situated at Delhi. He is the person authorized for making some important decisions at his level. The NCC India is further



divided into different levels across the country for better management and training. For the sake of convenience and an effective management, the country has been divided into 17 Directorates covering all States and Union Territories of the country. Each of the State National Cadet Corps Directorate Headquarters controls two to fourteen Group Headquarters. While Brigadiers or their equivalent commands all the Directorates, the Groups are commanded by Colonels or equivalents from the Air Force and the Navy, NCC Units are commanded by Major/Lieutenant Colonel or their equivalents. The directorate general is supreme, controlling all the directorates, which are responsible for managing all the groups. These groups are further made up of different units and can be divided into senior divisions or the junior divisions. This senior and junior division can be referred to as college level and school level training given to NCC candidates.



History of the Senior Division NCC Unit of the Vishwavidyalaya – The senior division unit of the Vishwavidyalaya has along history. The brief history of the SD unit is as follows –

- a. **Raising of the Unit** – Initially unit was raised at Saugor as 13 M P Signal Section NCC, Saugor (M.P.) in January, 1956 and Captain M . L. Bawa was the first Officer Commanding (OC) of the unit. Since it's raising unit is located at Saugor (M.P.).



- b. Up-gradation and Re-designation** – In January, 1963 the initially raised (13 M P Signal Section NCC) unit was upgraded to Signal Company. It was designated to be 13 M P Signal Company NCC, Saugor and the male cadets (Senior Division) of Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar formed the nucleus of this Company. Subsequently, in June, 1964 the unit was further re-designated as 3 M P Signal Company NCC under the Saugor Group of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh Directorate of National Cadet Corps. (M.P.). Since, in the year 1977 after some readjustments 09 Junior Division (JD) troops were allotted to this company, hence, 3 M P Signal Company NCC now consists of 01 Senior Division (SD) Company along with 09 Junior Division (JD) troops.
- c. Conversion of Company into Independent Company** – As per Letter No. Dte/60007/P&C/Conv/32A, dated 31 January, 2004 of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh NCC Directorate, Bhopal, the designation of 3 M P Signal Company NCC was further changed to 9 M P (Indp) Company NCC, Saugor (M.P.). Present Designation of Unit Further, as per letter No. Dte/60007/P&C/Conv/Corr/32A, dated 16 September, 2004 of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh NCC Directorate, Bhopal, the designation of 9 M P (Indep) Company NCC, Saugor (M.P.) was again changed to 3 M P Signal Company NCC, Saugor (M.P.).
- d. Present Authorized Strength of Senior Division Company** – The strength of senior division unit comprises of officers and cadets. The authorized strength of officers i.e. Associate NCC Officer (ANO) is 02 and authorized strength of cadets is 200.

Mission of NCC – The aim behind under taking NCC-like training would be to inculcate discipline, character, comradeship, leadership qualities and intrinsic values of nationalism among school children mainly with an aim to groom the youth, boys and girls both, nurture them and channelize their energy towards nation building by making them responsible citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces.



The Core Values of NCC – The NCC is a responsive, learning and continuously evolving organization. Its activity is guided by certain Core Values that we endeavor to instill among all ranks of the NCC. These include the following –

- A sense of patriotic commitment to encourage cadets to contribute to national development.
- Respect for diversities in religion, language, culture, ethnicity, life style and habitat to instill a sense of National unity and social cohesion.
- Abiding commitment to learn and adhere to the norms and values enshrined in the Indian Constitution.
- Understanding the value of a just and impartial exercise of authority.
- Ability to participate in community development and other social programme.
- A healthy life style free of substance abuse and other unhealthy practices.
- Sensitivity to the needs of poor and socially disadvantaged fellow citizens.
- Inculcating habits of restraint and self-awareness.
- Understanding the values of honesty, truthfulness, self-sacrifice, perseverance and hard work.
- Respect for knowledge, wisdom and the power of ideas.

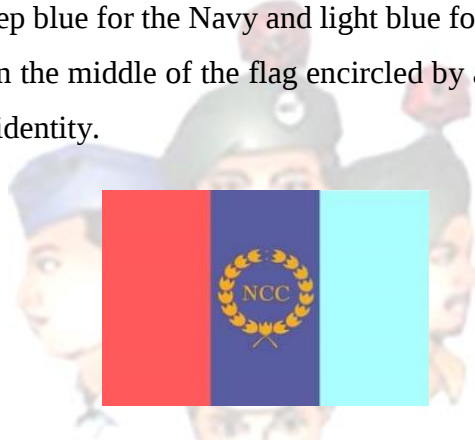
Objectives of NCC – The NCC is functioning with the following objectives –

- To develop unity and discipline among the cadets.
- To develop the feelings of obey among the cadets with smile.
- To develop punctuality among the cadets.
- To develop the feeling of work hard among the cadets without fuss.
- To function with making no excuses and telling no lies.
- To develop leadership among the cadets.
- To develop the feeling of national integration among the cadets.
- To develop adventurous feeling among the cadets.
- To develop military like life style among the cadets.
- To make physical and community development by the cadets.



The Motto of NCC – The need for having motto for the Corps was discussed in the 11th Central Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting held on 11 August 1978 and after the deliberation, the final decision for selection of ‘Unity and Discipline’ as motto for the NCC was taken in the 12th CAC meeting held on 12 October 1980. So, presently the NCC is functioning with the motto of ‘Unity and Discipline’.

The NCC Flag – The NCC flag for various units of the NCC was first introduced in 1951. The flag was of same pattern, color and size as was used by various regiments of the Army. The only difference was that it had the NCC badge and unit designation placed in the center. Later on it was felt that the flag should be in keeping with the inter-service character of the Corps. In 1954 the existing tri-color flag was introduced. The three colors in the flag depict the three services of the Corps, red for the Army, deep blue for the Navy and light blue for the Air Force. The letters NCC and the NCC crest in gold in the middle of the flag encircled by a wreath of lotus, give the flag a colorful look and a distinct identity.



The NCC Logo – The logo of NCC comprises of tri-color having ‘Red’ color for Army Unit, ‘Deep Blue’ for Naval Units and ‘Light Blue’ for Air Units of NCC. The base of tri-color of logo is assembled with the NCC golden crest in middle encircled by a wreath of lotus floral representation indicating the NCC directorates of NCC in India. The motto of NCC i.e. ‘Unity and Discipline’ is written below the logo.



The NCC Day – The NCC Day is celebrated to commemorate the raising of the NCC. It is our great opportunity that during the celebration of NCC week, the Vishwavidyalaya also celebrate the birth anniversary of its founder visionary ‘Doctor Sir Harisingh Gour’ on the 26 November in every year. The NCC Day is observed on the fourth Sunday of November of every year.

The Pledge of NCC – The NCC cadets pledge with the following wordings –

“We the cadets of the National Cadet Corps, do solemnly pledge that we shall always uphold the unity of India. We resolve to be disciplined and responsible citizen of our nation. We shall undertake positive community service in the spirit of selflessness and concern for our fellow beings.”

The Training and Activities of NCC – The NCC units of the Vishwavidyalaya provide ample opportunities to develop one’s physical and intellectual potentials through institutional training and camps. The qualifications in NCC prove advantageous to the students in their future career. Every year cadets of the Vishwavidyalaya attend different training camps as per the schedule provided by the directorate, group and unit time to time. Besides camp NCC also conducted many other activities given as below -

- a. Institutional Trainings** – It includes common subjects and special subjects. The common subjects are taught by ANOs and the special subjects are taught by Permanent Instructor (PI) staff of the respective NCC units of the Vishwavidyalaya. The practical aspects of training include foot drill, weapon drill, arms drill, weapons training, self-defence, map reading, field craft & battle craft and judging distance etc.
- b. NCC Camps** – During the course of training the cadets are exposed with various NCC camps organized by different NCC directorates, NCC groups and NCC units such as Basic Leadership Camp (BLC), Pre-Republic Day Camp (PRDC), Youth Exchange Programme (YEP), Advanced Leadership Camp (ALC), Course at Himalayan Mountaineering Institute Darjeeling, Para Troopers Camp (PTC), National Integration Camp (NIC), Army Attachment Training Camp, Republic Day Camp (RDC), Hiking and Trekking Camp, Thal Sainik Camp (TSC) and Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC).
- c. Social Service and Community Development** – Besides institutional training and NCC camps the NCC also serves for society through community development programme cum



social service activities like sapling plantations, blood donation camps, social awareness rallies, cleanliness drives of statues & water bodies and during COVID-19 pandemic NCC has conducted many social services.

- d. Adventure Activities** – Many adventurous activities are also part of NCC training. It includes the adventurous training like cycle expedition, trekking camps, sports and games etc.
- e. Sports and Games** – Sports and games are integral part of NCC activities. Many sports and games activities are conducted during the camps and many other specialized camps are also conducted time to time devoted for sports and games.

The NCC Song – The NCC song being played and sung along with recorded music of 16 mm color film had also been made with title ‘Hum Sab Bhartiya Hain’ of 7½ minutes duration. This NCC song is liked by millions of cadets, both past and present, and is sung on all important occasions of the NCC.

The NCC Certificates – The reputed certificate ‘A’, ‘B’ and ‘C’ examinations are conducted after certain years of training to assess the achievements of the cadets. The cadets of the Vishwavidyalaya are only eligible for certification with ‘B’ and ‘C’ examinations conducted by NCC Group Headquarter and MP & CG Directorate, Bhopal respectively. The ‘C’ certificate is the highest recognition of training and qualification of a senior NCC cadet whereas the ‘B’ certificate is the initial recognition of training and qualification of a senior NCC cadet. The ‘A’ certificate is provided to junior NCC cadets after due course of training.



Certificates Examinations – At senior level certificate ‘B’ and ‘C’ examinations are conducted.

- a. **Certificate ‘B’ Examination** – For the ‘B’ certificate examination a Senior Division/Wing cadet must be in second year of NCC training. Further s/he must have attended one Annual Training Camp/NIC/Attachment training with regular Army, Navy, Air Force Units. The cadets possessing 'A' Certificate will be awarded 10 bonus marks for higher certificate examination. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of total training period laid down in the syllabus for the first and second years for Senior Division/Wing NCC (All Wings). Break in the NCC service of the cadet SD/SW prior to appearing in the examination should not exceed more than 18 months at one time, after his discharge to count his service for Certificate 'B' Examination. In case the break exceeds 18 months the following procedure will be adopted. If s/he had been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before his discharge and had attended 75% of the total periods during his NCC service, s/ he will need another 45 periods of training to become eligible for certificate 'B' Examination. In all other cases where above conditions are not fulfilled, the cadet must attend a minimum 75% periods of the first and second years of training. An Air Wing Cadet must do a minimum of 10 Glide launches.
- b. **Certificate ‘B’ Examination** – For ‘C’ Certificate examination a Senior Division/Wing cadet must have passed 'B' certificate examination. The cadet must be in second/third year of SD/SW NCC training. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of the periods of 3rd year syllabus during the academic session. Break in the NCC service of the SD/SW cadet prior to appearing in the exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time, after his discharge to count his previous service for Certificate 'C' examination. In case the break exceeds 18 months, the following procedure will be adopted. If he had been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before her/ his discharge and had attended 75% of the total period during his NCC service, s/he will need another 45 periods of training to become eligible for certificate 'C' examination. In all other cases where above conditions are not fulfilled, the cadet must attend a minimum of 75% periods of the first and second year of training. It is mandatory the cadets that s/he must have attended two camps. There is permission to appear in certificate examination after discharge. For this the cadets who ceased to be on rolls of NCC may be permitted to appear for certificate 'A' Examination for Junior Division/Wing and 'B' & ‘C’ for Senior Division/Wing NCC at their own expenses within a period of 12 months of their discharge from the NCC, provided they were otherwise eligible at the time of their discharge.
- c. **Examination of Ex-cadets** – The ex-cadet so eligible can appear for the examination at any place in India by applying for the same, alongside with discharge certificate, to local unit Commander. The Group Commander of NCC is empowered to accept such requests from the ex-cadets.
- d. **Improvement of Grade** – There is provision of re-test of cadet to improve her/his grade. The re-test for improvement of grading in 'C' Certificate - With a view to give cadets a



chance to apply for the NCC Special Entry Scheme, in case their grading improves, it has been ruled that the cadets who have obtained a 'C' grading in NCC 'C' Certificate examination and who wish to improve their grading will be allowed to appear for a retest. But only one retest will be allowed to cadet for improving the grading.

- e. Re-appear to Complete Certificate Examination** – There is opportunity for the cadets to complete certificate examinations. They will have to re-appear in the examination to complete certificate. The retest will be held along with fresh cases next year. During the period, these cadets may attend at least two weeks' Special Parade/Coaching classes to be organized by units after the academic session. Those cadets who do not attend the Special Parade/Classes will also be eligible to appear in the re-test. No refreshment or other allowance will be admissible for these classes/parade/retest.

The Benefits and Incentives for NCC Cadets – Being an NCC cadet the individual can get following benefits and incentives in her/his career –

i) NCC Benefits

- **Army (PC):** Cadets of Army Wing through CDSE: PC-13.
- **Navy (PC):** Cadets of Naval Wing through CDSE: PC-06.
- **IAF (PC):** Cadets of AF Wing through CDSE (Flying): 10 % (03)- NCC Special Entry.
- **Army (SSC):** Through NCC Special Entry Scheme (Non-Tech) Course (Cadets of Army / Naval / Air Wing): 45 vacancies for men & 04 for women.
- **Navy (SSC):** Cadets of Army / Naval / Air Wing are given relaxation of 5% in cut off marks towards shortlisting for SSB.
- **IAF (SSC):** 10 % seats out of AFCAT vacancies through NCC Special Entry (Cadets of Air Wing).
- **MO in AMC:** 'A' Certificate- 02, 'B' Certificate- 03, and 'C' Certificate- 05.
- **Military Nursing Service (MNS):** One seat is reserved.
- **ICG (Assistant Commandant):** Maximum 5% relaxation in aggregate in the degree certificate.
- You get to attend the Annual Training Camps and gain new experiences.
- You get to march at the Rajpath during the Republic Day event.
- If selected you get to attend the Para training camps.
- You can get chance to trek in various hill stations.



- Selected candidates get basic and advanced mountaineering courses.
- Cash awards to teams and individuals for excellence in NCC games.
- There are youth exchange programs to give you International outreach.

ii) Agniveer & Regular Cadre Recruitment – Bonus marks for NCC Certificate holders in tri-services of Indian Armed Forces -

- **Army:**
 - ‘A’ Certificate – 05 marks
 - ‘B’ Certificate – 10 marks
 - ‘C’ Certificate – 15 to 20 marks
 - NCC ‘C’ Cert and participated in Republic Day Parade – 20 to 25 marks
- **Navy:**
 - Given but not specified
- **Air Force:**
 - ‘A’ Certificate – 03 marks
 - ‘B’ Certificate – 04 marks
 - ‘C’ Certificate – 05 marks

iii) Bonus marks/relaxation – Below officer level recruitment following benefits can get the NCC certificate holder candidate –

- **Relaxation in physical measurement:** Son of serving soldier/sailor/airman/ESM/son-in-law of war widow/son of widow and sportsperson (all specified level)
- **Army:** Bonus marks (5 to 20) are awarded to Sports persons who have represented at various levels
- **Army:** 20 to 50 bonus Marks for ITI/Skill qualified for AV Tech category & 15 marks for 'O' level (IT) or higher Course Cert issued by NIELIT for AV Clerk/SKT

iv) Incentives to NCC Cadets by Cadets Welfare Society –

- **Scholarships:** Cadet Welfare Society provides yearly 1000 scholarships of Rs. 6000/- each (one time) based on academic performance. Out of total 1000 vacancies, minimum $\frac{1}{4}$ i.e. 250 scholarships are given to cadets coming from rural/disturbed areas.



- **Financial Assistance/Relief:** In case of a death during normal NCC activity, the nominee is provided a financial assistance of Rs. 4,50,000/- and in case of death in high risk activity Rs. 5 lacs. It also takes care of treatment if injury takes place during any NCC activity.
- **Best Cadet Awards:** Based on the performance of a cadet in NCC, there are Best and 2nd Best Cadet awards constituted at the Group HQ level. The Best cadet is given an award of Rs. 3,500/- and 2nd Best Rs. 2,500/- only.

v) NCC Certificate Incentives in Career –

- NCC cadets get reservation in several competitive examinations.
- Awarded additional marks for NCC certificates in recruitment of Indian army soldier.
- Preference is given to candidates with 'C' certificate in various state government jobs.
- Awarded marks in paramilitary forces if you possess an NCC certificate.
- You get a special entry in SSB interview if you have a 'C' certificate.
- NCC cadets can get recruited as Civilian Gliding instructors / Girl Cadet Instructors / Whole Time Lady Officers.
- NCC 'C' Certificate Benefits in Government Jobs.
- 5 to 10 percent bonus marks awarded for recruitment as ORs, Sailors, Airmen.
- 2 to 10 bonus marks awarded for recruitment in Para Military Forces.
- Department of telecommunication awards bonus marks in recruitment.
- In CRPF NCC cadets holding 3rd division degree is eligible for recruitment to gazetted posts.
- Preference for State Services in certain States.
- Selected industries give preference to NCC 'C' certificate holders for various jobs related with the field of security.

vi) NCC 'C' Certificate Benefits in CDS – On clearing CDSE and subsequent SSB, cadets will get following reservation in various academies -

- A separate merit list is prepared for NCC cadets with 'C' certificate.
 - IMA – 13-15 vacancies reserved for 'C' Certificate (Army Wing) holders.



- INA – 05-08 vacancies reserved for ‘C’ Certificate (Naval Wing) holders.
- Special Entry (Men and Women)
 - OTA Chennai – 50 vacancies for ‘C’ certificate holders for NCC Special Entry (non-tech).
 - AFA Hyderabad – 10% vacancies reserved for ‘C’ certificate (Air Wing) holders in all courses.
- NCC ‘C’ Certificate Benefits in Army
 - ‘C’ certificate Holders and who have participated in republic day parade will be exempted from CEE for rect sol clerk /SKT, sol tech and sol NA cat and will be awarded 100% marks in lieu of CEE.
 - NCC ‘C’ certificate holders will be given 5% of the maximum marks of the examination as bonus marks in central para military forces.

vii) NCC ‘C’ Certificate Benefits in UPSC

- In UPSC civil services examination it would not help you directly but you have fair chances of making an impression in the interview if you hold NCC ‘C’ Certificate as you will be different from others owing to the training you received in NCC.
- UPSC conduct the CDS exam but having a ‘C’ certificate allows you to appear directly for SSB interview and let’s not forget about the reservation for NCC cadets after clearing CDSE.

Who & how to join? The NCC cadets are enrolled among the bonafied undergraduate students of the different schools of the Vishwavidyalaya which are preferably from first semester students of undergraduate programmes. The interested students go through written, physical and medical tests before selection. After successful completion of the tests, they are selected by the PI staffs of the respective NCC units. The application from the interested students received by the respective NCC units for final selection of the PI staffs of the units.

Associate NCC Officer (ANO) – The Associate NCC Officer is the back bone and key functionary of NCC unit in the Vishwavidyalaya. An ANO is a regular faculty member of the Vishwavidyalaya nominated by the Vice-Chancellor and selected by the ADG NCC of the NCC Directorate. S/he undertakes the appointment from Director General NCC, New Delhi after the successful completion of pre-commissioned course (PRCN). The ANO is responsible for all activities related to NCC in the Vishwavidyalaya. The ANO is official in-charge of NCC unit. The functions of ANO are as follows –

- To control and command the NCC cadets of the Vishwavidyalaya.
- To conduct regular institutional parades including common and special subjects.
- To assist the NCC unit for implementation of NCC training at Vishwavidyalaya level.
- To conduct social service and community develop programmes.
- To conduct orientation programmes for the NCC cadets.
- To facilitate for organising camps training for the NCC cadets.
- To assist for conducting certificate examinations.
- To ensure implementation of regular NCC activities and special camping programmes.
- To enrolment of NCC cadets among the students of the Vishwavidyalaya.

In addition to above functions of Associate NCC Officer, the ANO has many roles some of them are as follows –

- As a Leader – The ANO needs to lead in organizing training, camps and other activities related to NCC mandates.
- As an Educator – The ANO needs to update the cadets by organizing orientation programmes to improve personal skills in the students enrolled as NCC cadets.



- As an Administrator – The ANO needs to take prior approvals from the NCC units before conducting any NCC activity.
- As an Organizer – The ANO needs to organize training, camps and other activities related to the aim of NCC and also the activities suggested by the NCC mandate.
- As a Coordinator – The ANO needs to coordinate with NCC units for all training, camps and activities to be conducted in the Vishwavidyalaya by the NCC cadets.
- As a Supervisor – The ANO needs to supervise all NCC training, camps and other activities conducted by the NCC cadets of the Vishwavidyalaya.
- As a Public Relation Person – The ANO has to exhibit public relation skills to be an example for NCC cadets.

NCC as General Open Elective Credit Subject – Currently NCC training is imparted as extra-curricular activity to volunteer students from recognized schools and colleges who enroll as cadets. NCC as a Credit Course is designed with an intent to transform NCC training into a curricular activity from an extra-curricular thereby providing academic credits to students undergoing NCC training along with other attended advantages to the cadets in the college/university. The institutional training is the mainstay of NCC training and it is conducted at colleges and universities by Associate NCC Officers and Armed Forces personnel. The application of knowledge gained through institutional training is further honed or developed to a higher degree in NCC Camps. The Institutional Training syllabus comprises Common Subjects and Specialized Subjects (military component). NCC Credit Course is designed to offer Institutional Training of Senior Wing /Division is over six semesters (three years), comprising 330 periods (excluding Camp), of which 150 periods are meant for theory with 10 credits and 180 periods for practical with 6 credits. Each period is counted as hour. The ratio between theory and practical in terms of number of hours of training is 5:6, but in terms of credits is 5:3, since as per CBCS two hours of practical is counted towards one period of training as against one hour for theory. In addition, two separate courses have been designed for two Camps normally referred to as Annual Training Camps (ATC).

In the Vishwavidyalaya now NCC would not remain an extra-curricular activity and recently at least 91 universities across the country including Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya [Point APC:M28:(17) of 28th APC minutes, dated August 02, 2021] have adopted it as General Elective



Credit Course (GECC) under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) by the letter received from the University Grants Commission vide D.O.No.1-18/2019 (CPP-II) dated April 15 2021 to implement NEP-2020. Professor Ambika Datta Sharma, Dean of Student's Affairs and Head, Department of Philosophy of the Vishwavidyalaya has appointed as Nodal Officer for the adopted Open General Elective Credit Subject in the Vishwavidyalaya. To implement the adopted NCC as General Open Elective Credit Subject in the Vishwavidyalaya, the competent authority of the Vishwavidyalaya has recently constituted an Adhoc Board of Studies (BoS) to implement the NCC as General Open Elective Credit Subject in the Vishwavidyalaya.

Achievements of NCC Units – The cadets of the SD and SW units of the Vishwavidyalaya participated at state level and national level competitions and their performances are being recognized by the different assessment bodies. In the past session of 2011-22, the SD cadets of the Vishwavidyalaya were participated in All India Thal Sainik Camp (TSC) and achieved 3th rank event of ‘Map Reading’, two SD cadets were selected for Republic Day Camp and also participated in PM Rally. Recently, SD cadets were conducted a rally on the occasion of World Earth Day.
